THE HAWTHORN STORY

The Hawthorn Football Club has a proud history. It is the only Club in the AFL to have grown from a small suburban team. From 1902 the Club played in the Metropolitan Junior Football Association then joined the Victorian Football Association in 1914. Hawthorn was then invited to join the Victorian Football League in1925 becoming one of the powers of the now national competition, the Australian Football League.

1902 Hawthorn Football Club Formed and joins the Metropolitan Junior Football Association

Guernsey blue with red & white braces.

1906 Constitution of HFC Adopted

1914 HFC enters the Victorian Football Association

Guernsey changes to brown with gold yoke & initials HFC

- 1916 The VFA suspended the competition for 3 years during World War1.
- 1919 VFA competition resumes.
- 1923 First (and only) appearance in VFA Finals.

1925 HFC invited to join the Victorian Football League

Guernsey stays brown with gold V & initials HFC

- 1927 Club called the Mayblooms
- 1937 New Red Brick Grandstand opened (named The Tuck Stand in1992).
- 1943 Roy Cazaly names HFC the Hawks
- 1950 The Guernsey changes to the vertical stripes.

1961 1st VFL Premiership

- 1962 Social Club opens
- 1965 Beau Wallace retires as Head Trainer, served from 1919 R1 Record crowd 35,500 at Glenferrie
- 1970 Ken Goddard appointed Head Trainer, part of 9 Premierships, an AFL record

- 1973 Last home game at Glenferrie
- 1974 Home games played at Princes Park,

1976 3rd VFL Premiership, now known as the Cup for Crimmo

1978 4th VFL Premiership

1990 VFL now known as the AFL (National Competition)

- 1996 Merger proposal with Melbourne defeated by vote of HFC Members
